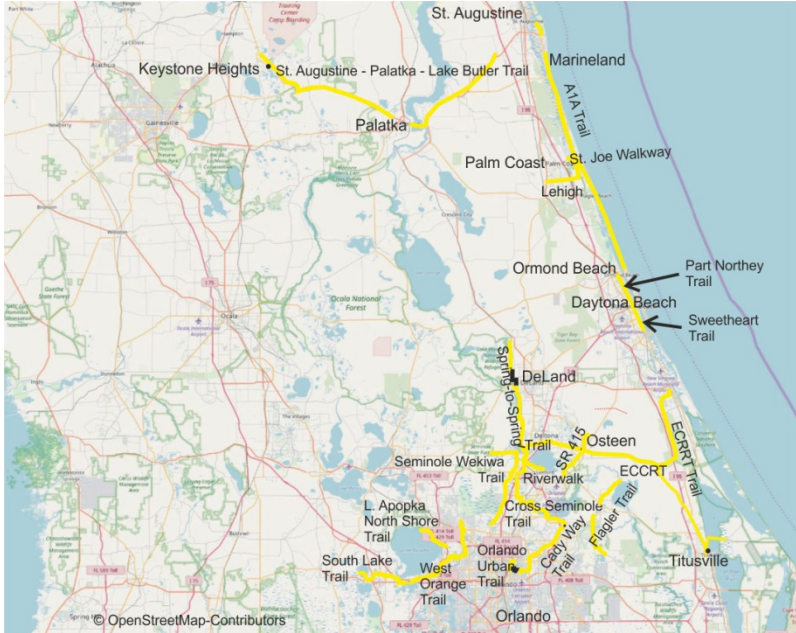
For a country dominated by motorists like USA, it's amazing how many well-developed bike trails there are in Florida. This ranges from sandy trails through the wild nature parks, beautifully paved paths in urban areas, to difficult mountain bike trails in selected parks such as Doris Leeper or Chuck Lennon. But the chief attractions are the beautiful Multi Use Trails across the country that have been created only in recent years and are not yet completely finished. So is a 260 miles long bike trail under construction / planning, from the St. Johns River through Volusia, Flagler, Putnam, St. Johns and Brevard Counties. This little booklet is mainly about these well-developed trails, for which there is often no up-to-date information on the Internet.

Note on location: In Central Florida, most cities merge, it's difficult to tell where they start and where they end. That's why I apologize if I've mistaken a place.
